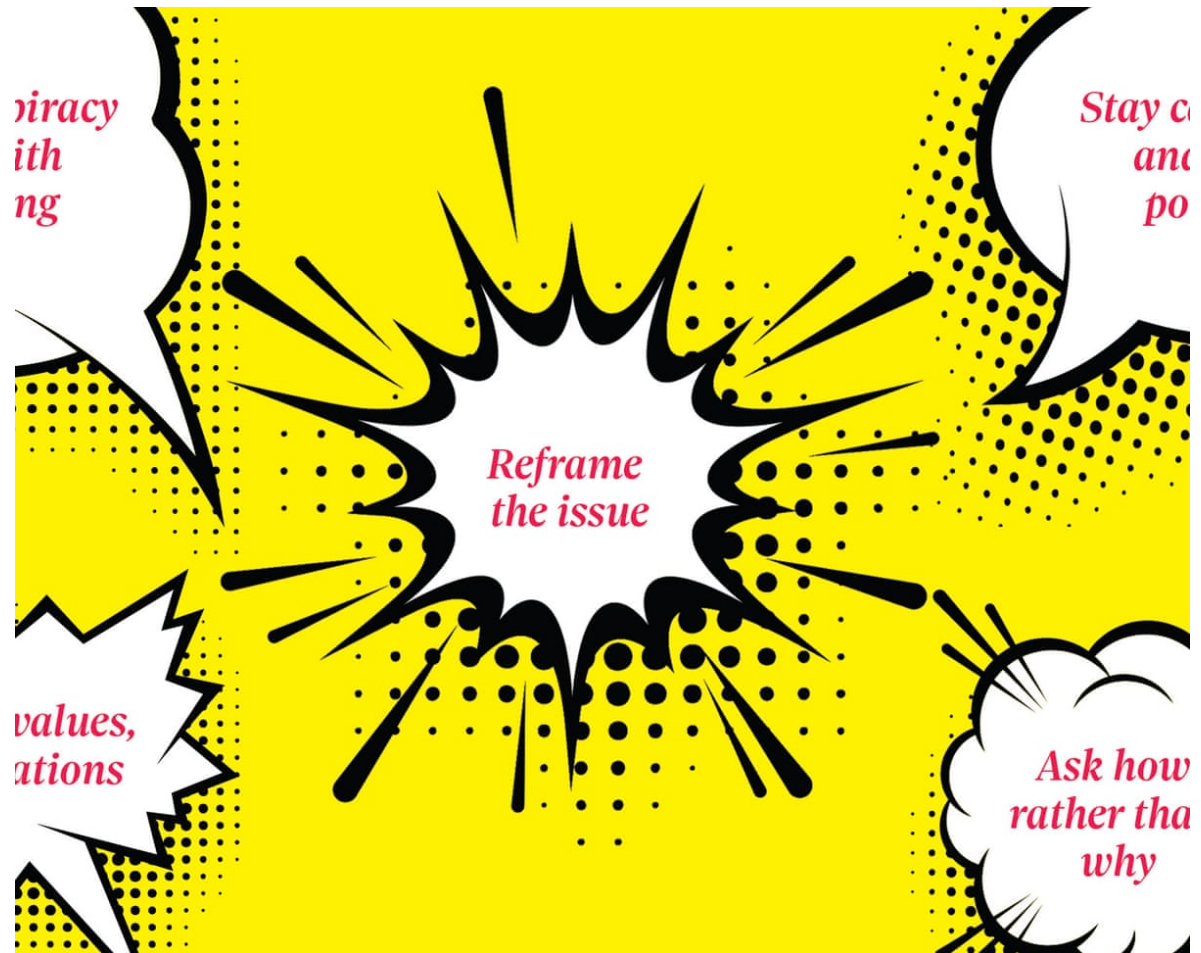

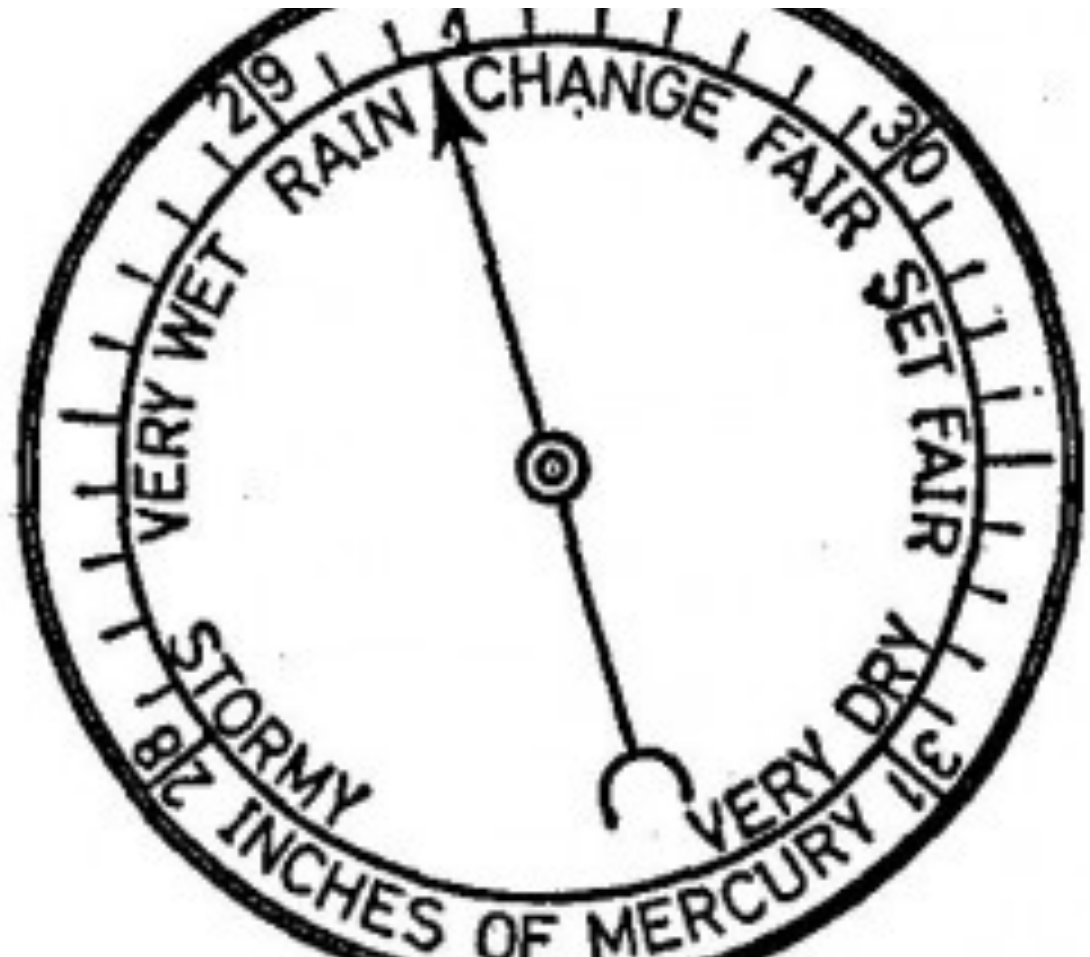
controversy

Black Lives Matter or the official #BlackLivesMatter builds power to bring justice, healing, and freedom to Black people across the globe

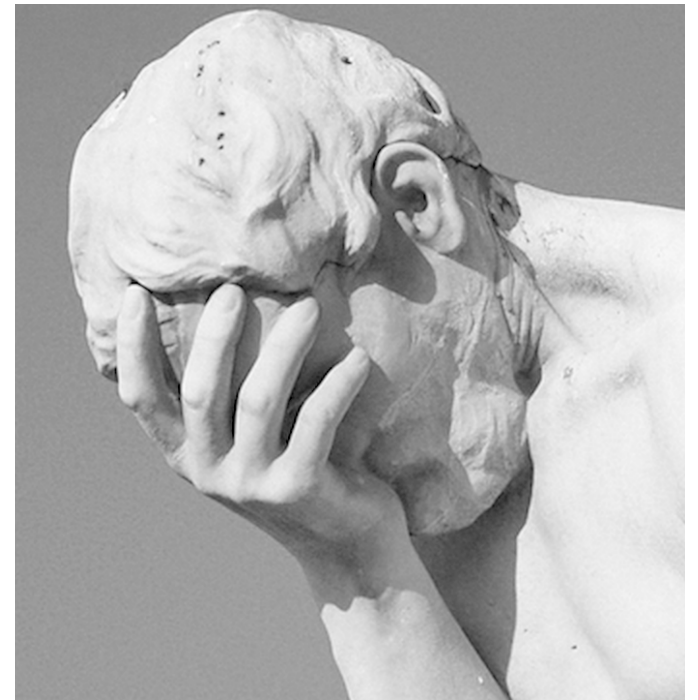

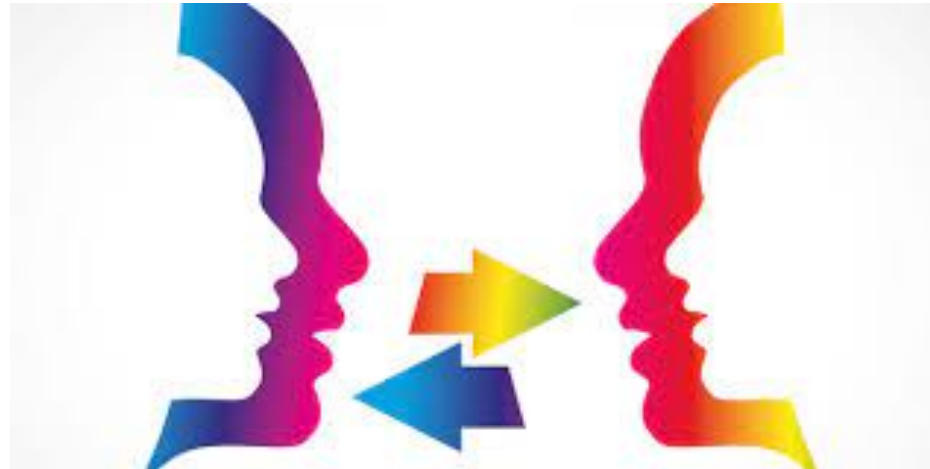

Shame is a painful feeling of humiliation or distress caused by the consciousness of wrong or foolish behaviour



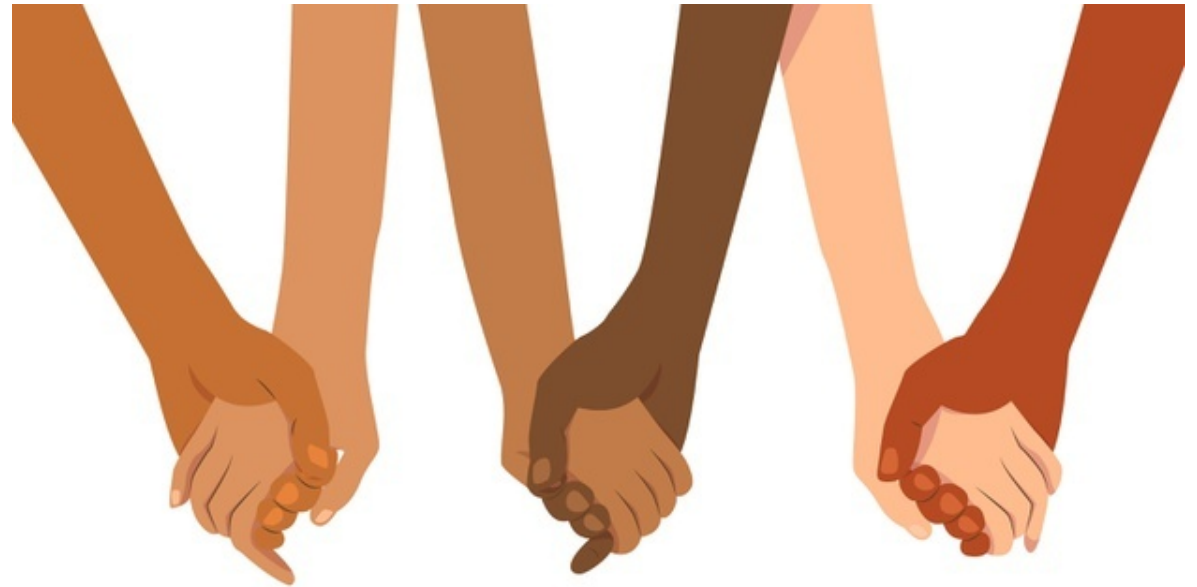


discourse
