Truth, Bias, and the News

Objective: You will select a specific social topic for example, marginalization of people, prison system, environment, and COVID and mandatory masks. Type up *Truth, Bias, and the News* as a multi-paragraph expository write. Use MLA writing style, and use this worksheet to guide your research.
